

Year in Review

We were very busy at The Caring Place in 2016. We served 21% more people than we did in 2015 and the number of new families to The Caring Place grew by 14%!

Our Food Pantry was also very busy, breaking records for the most people served in one month.

We believe there are several reasons for the growing number of families seeking help from The Caring Place. Last year, we undertook a broader community outreach effort which resulted in more people learning about our services. This, in addition to the growth rate in Williamson County, made for increased service delivery across the organization.

2016 was also a year of recognition for all who support The Caring Place. We received 4 distinguished awards including:

- Best Place to Volunteer/Give in Georgetown for the 6th year in a row

- Central Texas Food Bank Platinum Designation


We know these awards really belong to the people who volunteer, donate, work for or otherwise support The Caring Place. Thank you for making it another great year for The Caring Place and those we serve.

The Important Role of Our Volunteers

Volunteers are critical to our success as an organization helping people in crisis. In 2016, 499 dedicated and committed volunteers served our community by giving 53,652 hours of service, which is equivalent to 26 full time employees, valued at \$1,264,041. In addition, community service volunteers provided a total of 8,266 hours which is equivalent to an additional 4 employees. Various schools, churches, organizations and businesses in Williamson County also donated their time and talent to help The Caring Place.

Each year, The Caring Place recognizes outstanding volunteers. While all of our volunteers are extraordinary, the following volunteers received special recognition in 2016 for their service in 2015:

A Closer Look at Our Food Programs

During 2016, The Caring Place distributed **914,827 pounds (457 tons)** of food to area families through four food programs. Utilizing the conversion formula provided by the Central Texas Food Bank in Austin of 1.2 pounds of food equaling one meal, The Caring Place provided 762,356 meals to area families in 2016.

THE FOOD PANTRY: Qualifying individuals and families may receive 10 days of food once a month.

OUR DAILY BREAD: Day-old bread and pastries are donated daily from H-E-B, delivered to The Caring Place by our dedicated volunteers.

FRESH FOOD FOR FAMILIES: Through our partnership with the Central Texas Food Bank (CTFB) in Austin, fresh fruits and vegetables are provided to The Caring Place for distribution to area families on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Mondays of the month.

HOPE (*Healthy Options Program for the Elderly*): This program is available to low income individuals age 55 and over. Eligible older adults receive supplemental food once per month.

Where Our Funding Comes From

In 2016, **\$1,667,282** of our funding came from the sale of donated, gently used and new items in our thrift store, which equals 68% of our total revenues received. The revenue generated from our thrift store, *The Shops at The Caring Place*, covers all of the operating costs

associated with running the organization. This ensures that 100% of all financial donations to The Caring Place go directly to help area families in need.

^{*}The total above does not include the value of food distributed through HOPE, Fresh Food For Families and Our Daily Bread as we cannot assign a value to the donated food received from the Central Texas Food Bank and H-E-B. Similarly, we cannot assign a value to the fans received from Family Eldercare.
