





In 2022, a refreshed and enlarged Food Pantry reopened for in-person visits with increased access and selection for all neighbors, thanks to your support. The Caring Place also added a remote distribution site in Jarrell, further expanding our in-person reach beyond Georgetown, Bartlett and Granger. The impact food makes in our community is crucial, and you make it happen.

The Programs & Services Department increased access to financial assistance through the release of a QR code to a secure enrollment portal. Technology like this allows The Caring Place to offer crisis assistance to more people including those who work full-time or have limited transportation.

This past year, nearly 1,000 families needed and received clothing at no cost to them from the donations you made to our thrift stores. 61% of all individuals The Caring Place served were new to our programs. These indicators tell us that the need is still here. With your help, The Caring Place will continue to be here for all neighbors in crisis.
