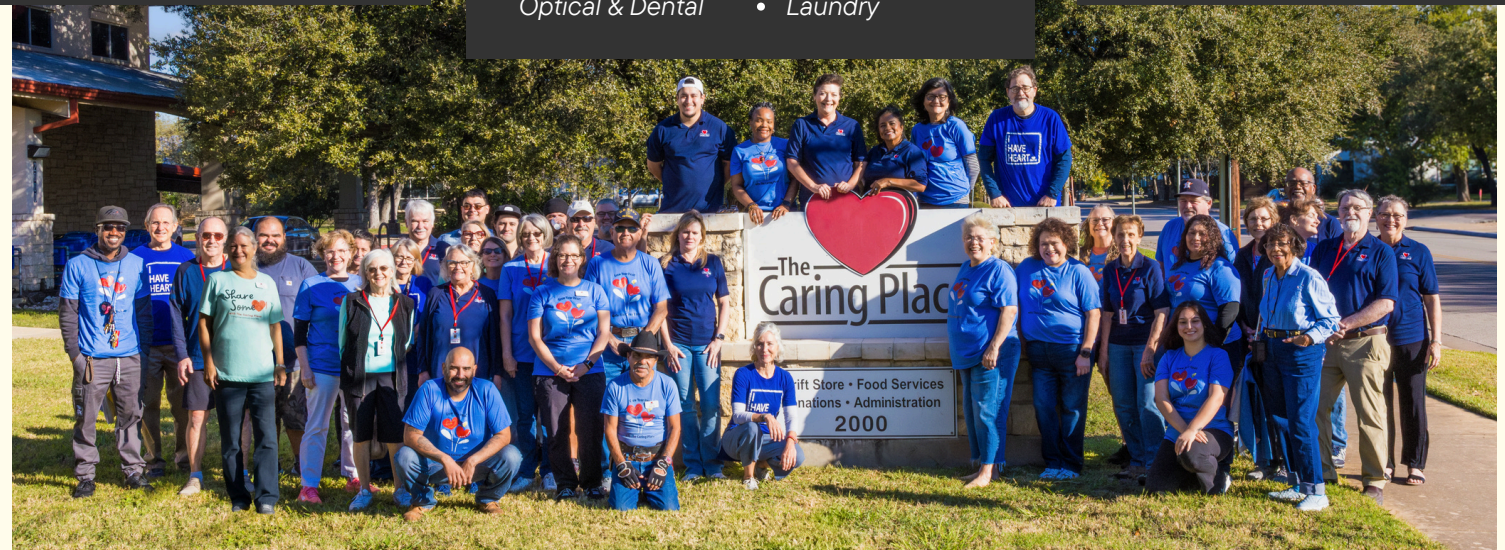

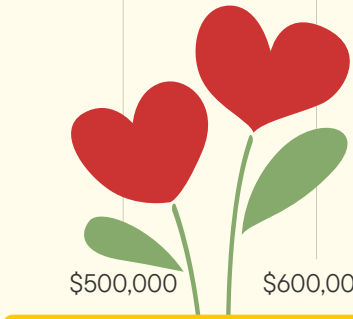
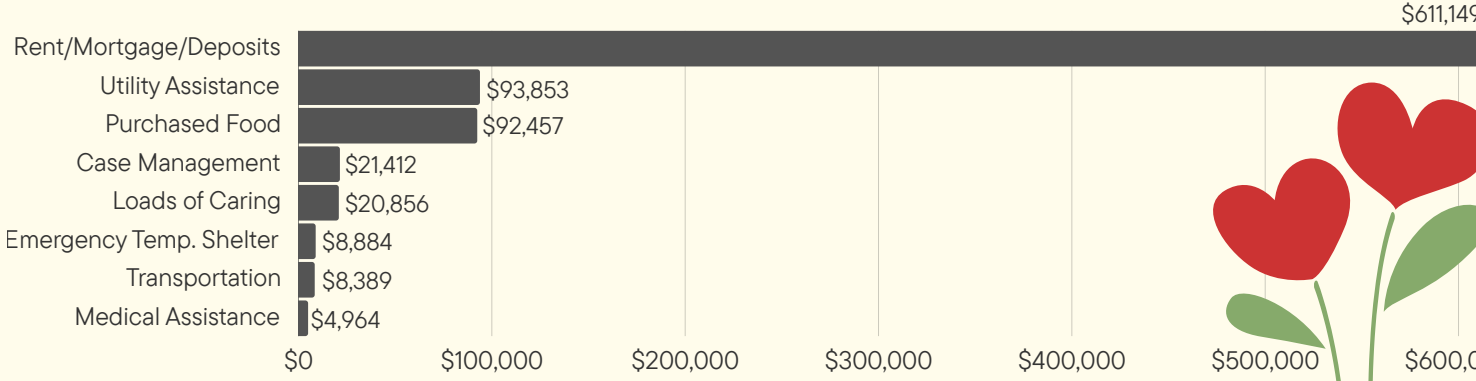

Planting Seeds of Hope: How Funds Were Utilized

Direct Financial Support: \$861,964



Value of Non-Financial Support: \$3,932,798

Non-financial support includes the quantifiable value of food, clothing, housewares and other necessities provided to our neighbors. These items are given through Food Pantry and Thrift Store vouchers.

Families who used the Food Pantry **saved an estimated \$211 per month** to use towards other critical expenses.

- The Food Pantry assisted 52,118 neighbors for through 17,740 pantry visits
- The Fresh Food for Families Program distributed 72,576 pounds of fresh produce to 7,397 families
- HOPE supported 1,208 adults with 55,335 pounds of supplemental food
- Neighbors redeemed \$187,594 worth of clothing and household items via vouchers at the thrift store
