LOOKING BACK

In 1986, The Caring Place completed its very first full year of service - and even then, the need was clear. We helped 1,000 families that year, a powerful reminder of why we opened our doors. That same year, we moved into a new space in the Industrial Park to better meet the growing demand.

But growth came quickly. By 1990, just four years later, we had outgrown that space and moved to a larger home at 2001 Railroad Avenue. It was a big step forward, and it gave us room to expand our services and deepen our impact.

In 1992, we faced an unexpected challenge: a fire caused extensive damage to our building. It was a difficult time, but it also revealed the caring of our community. With your support, we kept going. Adapting, rebuilding, and never losing sight of our mission.

The growth of the community and the need for our services led us to a new beginning in 2004, when we opened the doors of our current home at 2000 Railroad Avenue. Built with purpose and hope, it's a space that has allowed us to grow alongside the community we serve.

Today, as we reflect on 40 years of service, we're reminded that every challenge has made us even more committed to our mission and every step forward has been possible because of you.

2005 - 2025: BUILT TO SERVE, GROWN WITH PURPOSE

One theme has defined The Caring Place: expanding to meet the needs of families in crisis. As Georgetown and surrounding communities grew, so did the need for support - and we rose to meet it.

Piece by piece, our buildings were lovingly expanded and remodeled to ensure we had the space, resources, and infrastructure to serve our neighbors with dignity and care. Every addition was made with purpose, guided by the belief that no one should go without the basics.

Over the years, we've added space for all services and operations — all while staying rooted in our mission. Today, in 2025, The Caring Place is powered by a dedicated team of 35 staff members and an incredible 400 active volunteers who make our work possible every single day.



This year, our 40th Anniversary, we celebrated a major milestone: the completion of a 5,000+ square foot warehouse expansion. What was once an open exterior space is now a fully enclosed, functional part of our operations. Another step forward in our commitment to our neighbors.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to our mission and to growth, always guided by the needs of our community and the caring values that have sustained us through four decades of service.

OPEN HOUSE & BUILDING DEDICATION

The Caring Place celebrated 40 years of caring on June 5th 2025, during our Open House and Dedication of the warehouse addition which turned our outdoor donation receiving area into a beautiful new indoor workspace. The Caring Place received a generous bequest to allow for this 5,000 square foot expansion, which increases our ability to help more neighbors. In the past two years, TCP has seen a 76% increase in the number of neighbors presenting for help with basic needs. We have been able to meet that need thanks to your generous support and that of our caring community.

COMING SOON

The fall season can bring added financial stress for families with school-aged children. To help ease that burden, The Caring Place is in it's third year offering it's Back To School Voucher Program.

From **August 4-15**, qualifying families can enroll to receive \$15 vouchers per child (ages 18 and under) to help with clothing, shoes, backpacks, and school supplies. Vouchers will be valid through August 30 and can be redeemed at The Shops At The Caring Place (2000 Railroad Ave).

Who Qualifies?

- Children must be 18 or under
- Families must live within our service area
- Proof of residency and identification for each child are required
- Enrollment takes place at 2001 Railroad Avenue



Last year, 224 vouchers were redeemed, totaling over \$3,000 in support for local families. We're proud to continue this effort to make back-to-school a little easier for everyone.
